Agricultural economist with 45 years career of both academic and practical experiences in most of the fields of socio-economics and related areas. As professor of agricultural economics in the College of Agriculture of University of Menoufiya, Dr. El-Guendy has been and is teaching micro and macro-economic theories, statistics, econometrics, marketing, project analysis, farm management, agricultural policy, agricultural finance, agricultural development and planning and some other related courses for both under and post graduates as well as for trainees in several national and international training centers. He has supervised 25 M.Sc. and Ph.D. theses in the field. Over and above, he participated and / or organized several conferences, symposiums and workshops. Besides, he conducted and / or participated in 20 published scientific papers and 26 research reports, in three different languages, Arabic, French and English.

Practical experiences include involvement in research, implementation and managing several agricultural development programs and projects in Egypt, Libya, Palastine and Niger. Dr. El-Guendy worked for a lot of national and international organizations and institutions and private consulting firms. He worked for the WB, USAID, GTZ, UNDP, DANIDA, and the Arab Organization for Agricultural Development He participated, through the Arab Organization for Agricultural Development (AOAD), in designing integrated rural development projects for investment of the water of the main made great river in Libya. He was also a team member in the USAID funded Small Farmer Productivity Project implemented for the Egyptian Ministry of Agriculture. He also worked for 5 years full time as senior agricultural economist for the USAID funded \$300 million National Agricultural Research Project (NARP). In that project, he acted as production economist for the Policy Analysis Component for one year and as coordinator for the New Initiatives Component for 4 years. That component consisted of all activities related to

technology transfer of the most sophisticated technologies in the production and marketing of agricultural sector. He also coordinated and managed a groupe of field studies on marketing and foreign trade of horticultural commodities. These studies were carried out to discover the marketing windows for the main Egyptian Agricultural products in the sake of promoting Egyptian exports of agricultural commodities. It is on the bases of such studies that both the ATUT and ALEB projects were designed and implemented.

Over and above his responsibilities in the university, Dr. El-Guendy worked as a short term consultant in the USAID funded Agricultural Policy Reform Project (APRP) implemented for the Egyptian government. Through his work in this project, he conducted four main studies on Agricultural marketing and policy reform options in fertilizer sector, animal feed sub-sector, maize, and Egyptian competitiveness of the Egyptian cotton and textile industries. He also participated in the organization of several public awareness conferences and workshops on strategies and policy framework for those four sub-sectors. Besides, he has been involved in a field survey on corn production and uses in Egypt. He also participated in creating several export promotion websites that are in use now. Those sites include fruits and vegetables, rice, and cotton. All marketing statistics of such commodities are included in the dynamic database on which the websites are based.

Dr El Guendy worked as a team leader in a policy study for ElShams project. It is an USAID funded project for small scale agribusiness in Upper Egypt. It aims at helping small farmers in converting their activities into high value export products to increase their incomes.

Actually, Dr ElGuendy is one of two who are conducting an annual International WB training course in project analysis, evaluation monitoring and implementation. He has been assuming this training since 1995 to date in the forign department of the Ministry of Agriculture.
